Motion to open the meeting at 8:09pm made by Jordan Flavell-Boney, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Heinz Schroeder.

Mike McElduff awarded all the certificates to the winners of the Pitch, Hit and Run event held this past May.

Motion to approve the minutes as written from the May 17, 2016 meeting made by Heinz Schroeder, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jordan Flavell-Boney, all in favor, minutes approved.

<u>Softball:</u> Jordan Flavell-Boney reported the season is over now, but all went well.
